

I will try to make the community/family I live in, more like the Trinity.




3. THE HOLY TRINITY


We use symbols to express in some way what we believe about the Trinity.

Story: Augustine and the Trinity

One day a small boy was digging a hole in the sand by the sea. He had a shell and began taking the water from the sea and putting it into the hole. Walking up and down along the beach, thinking very hard, was the great Bishop Augustine. He was trying to understand the mystery of the Trinity -Three Persons; Father, Son, Spirit but only One God. How could it be? Suddenly he noticed the small boy running backwards and forwards from the sea to the hole. Augustine stopped and asked the small boy what he was doing. The boy replied, "I am

emptying all the water from the sea into this hole." "Oh, you can never do that," laughed the great Augustine. "If I can never do that," the small boy replied, "you will never understand how there can be Three Persons in the One God." Augustine realized God was giving him an important lesson. There are some things we cannot understand. We must have faith.

The Trinity is a mystery revealed to us by Jesus. It is too great for us to understand, however, we are baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and in faith we share in the life of the Trinity.

What is the Trinity?

4. IN THE CREED WE PROFESS OUR FAITH IN THE TRINITY

Each time I make the Sign of the Cross, I am calling on the Trinity, Father, Son and Spirit.

I believe in God the Father, Creator of heaven and earth.


I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

5. CREATION IS A REFLECTION OF THE TRINITY

God created all things to depend upon each other. Nothing in God's creation can exist by itself. They complete and serve each other. (Birds need air, fish need water, plants need soil, animals need plants...)





"I have provided all kinds of grain and all kinds of fruit for you to eat; but for all the wild animals and for all the birds I have provided grass and leafy plants for food" – and it was done." Gen. 1:29-30

The order and harmony in creation comes from the relationship that exists among all things that God has created. This harmony and relationship reflects the harmony and relationship that exists between Father, Son and Holy Spirit.



"O Lord my God when I in awesome wonder consider all the works your hands have made....."

I will become more aware of my own relationship with the rest of creation.



2. (4) What does the interdependence of all things in creation reflect?

The interdependence of all things in creation reflects the unity and harmony between Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

6. HARMONY IN THE BEGINNING

When God created the world it was good. He had a plan. There was harmony between God and human beings, between man and woman, between human beings and the rest of creation.

This harmony would continue as long as we followed God's plan.



Genesis 1:25-31a

"Then God said, "And now we will make human beings they

will be like us and resemble us. They will have power over the fish, the birds and all the animals, domestic and wild, large and small." So God created human beings, making them to be like himself, the created them male and female, blessed them, and said, "Have many children, so that your descendants will live all over the earth and bring it under their control. I am putling you in charge of the fish, the birds, and all the wild animals. I have provided all kinds of grain and all kinds of fruit for you to eat, but for all the wild animals and for all the birds. I have provided grass and leafy plants for food! — and it was done." God looked at everything he had made, and he was very pleased."

"Praise the Lord my soul! O Lord, my God, how great you are! Lord, you have made so many things! How wisely you made them all! The earth is filled with your creatures."


The beauty and harmony of creation ought to inspire my respect for God and obedience

7. HARMONY IS DESTROYED




"God created human beings in his image and established him in his friendship. Human beings can live this friendship only when they obey God. The command not to eat "of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil" spells this out: "for in the day that you eat of it, you shall die."


The story of the **Fall** tells of the refusal of God's creatures to obey God, their Creator.


Read Gen. 3:8-13,16-19.

God created all things in perfect harmony. Man and woman created in the image of God lived in friendship with God. All this changed when man and woman disobeyed God.

We call this first disobedience ORIGINAL SIN.







The friendship and harmony between God and people and the rest of creation was destroyed.

Disobedience destroys harmony.

4. (6) What was lost by original sin?
By original sin the friendship and harmony between God and people and the rest of creation was destroyed.

8. SIN CAUSES DISHARMONY

"Sin is an offence against God: Sin sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it. Like the first sin, it is disobedience against God. Sin is "love of oneself even to contempt of God."

Cain became furious, and he scowled in anger.

Then the Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry? Why that scowl on your face? If you had done the right thing, you would be smiling; but because you have done evil, sin is crouching at your door. It wants to rule you, but you must overcome it." Then Cain said to his brother Abel, "Let's go out for a walk." When they were out in the countryside, Cain turned to his brother and killed him. The Lord asked Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" He answered, "I don't know. Am I supposed to take care of my brother?" Gen. 4:5b-9



"No more lying, then! Each of you must tell the truth to each of the other believers, because we are all members together in the body of Christ. If you become angry, do not let your anger lead you into sin, and do not stay angry all day. Don't give the Devil a chance. If you used to rob you must stop robbing and start working, in order to earn an honest living for yourself and to be able to help the poor. Do not use harmful words, but only helpful words, the kind that build up and provide what is needed, so that what you say will do good to those who hear you. And do not make God's Holy Spirit sad; for the Spirit is God's mark of ownership on you, a guarantee that the day will come when God will set you free. Get rid of all bitterness, passion and anger. No more shouting or insults, no more hateful feelings of any sort. Instead, be kind and tenderhearted to one another, and forgive one another, as God has forgiven you through Christ. Eph. 4: 25-31

The story of Cain and Abel is an example of how one sin leads to another. Cain's first sin was jealousy.

Cain's sin began in his heart. He felt jealous and angry. God in his love warned him, but Cain did not listen.

For us too, sin starts in our heart. We have to be attentive to the warning, God in his love gives us. We can never say, "This is only a little sin." We have to say "No" to sin from the start. A sin often leads to another.

5. (7) What happens when we sin? When we sin we reject God's love.

9. DISUNITY - THE TOWER OF BABEL



"At first the people of the whole world had only one language and used the same words. As they wandered about in the East, they came to a plain in Babylonia and settled there. They said to one another, "Come on! Let's make bricks and bake them hard." So they had bricks to build with and tar to hold them together. They said, "now let's build a city with a tower that reaches the sky, so that we can make a name for ourselves and not be scattered all over the earth." Then the Lord came down to see the city and the tower which they had built, and he said, "Now then, these are all one people and they speak one language; this is just the beginning of what they are going to do. Soon they will be able to do

anything they want! Let us go down and mix up their language so that they will not understand each other." So the Lord scattered them all over the earth, and they stopped building the city. The city was called Babylon, because there the Lord mixed up the language of all the people, and from there he scattered them all over the earth." Genesis 11:1-9

The people of Babel wanted to do things on their own, without God, so they started quarreling and did not understand each other any longer. They separated and created disunity.

Sin is the root of divisions and war. Sin separates us from God, nature, others, other groups of people (nations).

People (we) are trapped in sin. This sad 'state' or situation is the consequence of "original sin".

Original sin opened the door to evil in the world. It affects the whole human race. Because of Original Sins we do not share in God's life when we are born.



Faith and Baptism gives Christians the power to overcome sin and live a new life in Christ.

10. JEALOUSY CAUSES DISUNITY

Gen. 37: 2b-11

Joseph took care of the sheep and goats with his brothers. He brought bad report to his father about what their brothers were doing. Jacob loved Joseph more than his other sons. He made a long robe with full sleeves for him. When his brothers saw that their father loved Joseph more than he love them, they hated their brother so much that they would not speak to him in a friendly manner.

One night Joseph had a dream, and when he told his brothers about it they hated him even more.....


Joseph had another dream and told his brothers about it. "I saw the sun, the moon, and eleven stars bowing down to me."

I will pray for someone of whom I have been jealous.


11. GOD HIMSELF RESTORES UNITY

The experience of Jacob's descendants in Egypt.


A time chart of the Israelites in Egypt

- Joseph in Egypt (Ex. 1:5b) (Ex. 1)

"The angel of the Lord appeared to Moses as a flame coming from the middle of the bush. Moses saw that the bush was on fire but that it was not burning up...."Why isn't the bush burning up? I will go closer and see." When the Lord saw that Moses was coming closer. he called to him from the middle of the bush and said. Moses! Moses! He answered. "Yes! Here I am!" God said, "Do not come



closer. Take off your sandals, because you are standing on holy ground. I am the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob."....Then God said, "I have seen how cruelly my people are being treated in Egypt. I have heard them cry out to be rescued from their slave drivers. I know all about their sufferings, and so I have come down to rescue them from the Egyptians......Now I am sending you to the king of Egypt so that you can lead my people out of this country." Ex 3: 2-10

12. PASSOVER

The First Passover:

"Then God said to Moses: Today, this very night, Pharaoh will let you go. Make yourselves ready to set out. Each family must slaughter a lamb. You must smear a sign on the door posts with its blood. Put on sandals. Take a staff in your hand. Eat hastily and leave nothing over. This night all the first-born sons of the Egyptians will die. But the Angel of Death will pass over your houses, which have been marked by the blood of the lamb. Everything happened just as God had said. The first-born sons of the Egyptians died. Then Pharaoh told Moses and Aaron: Go away, quickly! Take everything that belongs to you. The Israelites gathered together and set off out of Egypt."

Exodus 12:1-14, paraphrased



The people of Israel never forgot this first Passover night. The mothers and fathers did not forget how God had spared their own first-born sons. Since then they have always brought God an offering after the birth of their first-born son. Each year they still celebrate the Passover, the feast of the Exodus, and they explain it to their children like this:

"By using great power the Lord brought us out of Egypt, the place where we were slaves." (EX 13:14)

The Passover is a sign of the sacrifice of Jesus, the lamb of God. We are saved through his blood.

I will try to be grateful for everything, especially to Jesus for saving me through his blood.

13. FROM SLAVERY TO FREEDOM

The Lord told his people he would take them from the slavery of Egypt to freedom, but as soon as trouble came, the people complained. Moses believed and trusted in God. He told the people, "Don't be afraid, the Lord will fight for you." In this event God clearly showed that it was He who brought the Israelites from slavery to freedom. They were not saved by any effort of their own.

14. THE LAW IS GIVEN

Laws are necessary if people are to have order and harmony in life.





God had brought his people from the slavery of Egypt through the Red Sea to freedom. Now he wanted to make them into a strong united people. To do this he gave them a set of laws.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS:

- 1. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.
- 3. Honour your father and mother.
- 4. You shall not kill.
- 5. I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange gods before me.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steat.
- B. You shall not bear false witness against your neigbour.
- 9. You shall not covet you neighbour's wife,
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbour's goods.

"You saw what I, the Lord, did to the Egyptians and how I carried you as an eagle carries her young on her wings, and brought you here to me. Now, if you will obey me and keep my covenant, you will be my own people." Exodus 19:4-5a.

When PNG became independent, our Constitution, a law for the people in the country to follow, was drawn up.

The Ten Commandments were the Constitution of God's people.

Today we are God's people and the Ten Commandments are still laws for us to observe.

I will continue to obey God's Law as it is given in the Ten Commandments.


15. THE LAW IS GIVEN FOR A PURPOSE

Laws bring order and harmony into our lives.

"Go back, Moses, and listen to everything that the Lord our God says. Then return and tell us what he said to you. We will listen and obey." When the Lord heard this he said to me, "I have heard what these people said, and they are right.

If only they would always feel this way! If only they would always honour me and obey all my commands, so that everything would go well with them and their descendants forever.

"Go and tell them to return to their tents. But you, Moses, stay here with me, and I will give you all my laws and commands. Teach them to the people, so that they will obey them in the land that I am giving them.' "People of Israel, be sure that you do everything that the Lord your God has commanded you. Do not disobey any of his laws. Obey them all so that everything will go well with you and so that you will continue to live in the land that you are going to occupy." Deut. 5: 27-33

16. THE LAW IS FOR LIFE

"Today I am giving you a choice between good and evil, between life and death. 
To choose to love him and obey his laws, would mean life. To choose not to listen and disobey would mean death. We often have to make a choice between good and evil. I will choose what is good.

17. THE LAW GUIDES US

"Near King Ahab's palace there was a vineyard owned by Naboth. One day Ahab



said to Naboth, "let me have your vineyard.....I want to use the land ..." Naboth replied, "The Lord forbid that I should let you have it". Ahab went home, depressed and angry. Jezebel, his


wife, ordered Naboth to be killed. As soon as she received the message that Naboth was killed, she told Ahab, "Naboth is dead." At once Ahab went to the vineyard to take possession of it.

Then the Lord said to the prophet Elijah, "Go to King Ahab. ... Tell him that I, the Lord, say to him, 'After murdering the man, are you taking over his property as well? ... You have devoted yourself completely to doing what is wrong in the Lord's sight."

When Elijah finished speaking, Ahab tore his clothes, took them off, and put on sackcloth. He refused food, slept in the sackcloth, and went about gloomy and depressed.

The Lord said to Elijah, "Have you noticed how Ahab has humbled himself before me? Since

he has done this, I will not bring disaster on him." 1Kg. 21:1-10, 15-20, 27-29a.




It is good to have desires, hopes and plans for the future. The achieving of our good desires brings development for ourselves and others. There are desires that help others and desires that just concern self. They motivate us to work for what we want to achieve. 18. GOD'S PEOPLE DID NOT FOLLOW THE LAW



The law, the sign of God's promise and covenant, ought to have governed the hearts of God's people. "If you will obey my voice and keep my covenant you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation." But Israel wanted to become a kingdom like other nations.

"Listen while I sing this song, a song of my friend and his vineyard: My friend had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug the soil and cleared it of stones; he planted the finest vines. He built a tower to guard them, dug a pit for treading the grapes. He waited for the grapes to ripen, but every grape was sour. So now my friend says, "You people who live in Jerusalem and Juda, judge between my vineyard and me. Is there anything I failed to do for it? Then why did it produce sour grapes and not the good grapes I expected? - This is what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away the hedge around it, break down the wall that protects it, and let wild animals eat it and trample it down. I will let it be overgrown with weeds... I will let thorns cover it. I will even forbid clouds to let rain fall on it.

Israel is the vineyard of the Lord Almighty; the people of Juda are the vines he planted. He expected them to do what was good, but instead they committed murder. He expected them to do what was right, but their victims cried out for justice." Is. 5:1-7

God had a plan for his people. He brought them from the slavery of Egypt through the hardships of the desert to the promised land. God kept his promise to be their God, but they did not keep their promise to be his people. They became like the pagan people around them and caused others to suffer.


19. THE MESSAGE OF THE PROPHETS - A

20. THE MESSAGE OF THE PROPHETS - B

And so, keeping quiet in such evil times is the clever thing to do!—Make it your aim to do what is right, not what is evil, so that you may live. Then the Lord God Almighty really will be with you, as you claim he is. Hate what is evil, love what is right, and see that justice prevails in the courts." Amos 5:12-15a.



21. ISRAEL LONGS FOR A SAVIOUR

In the course of its history, Israel was able to discover that God had only one reason to reveal himself to them, for choosing them from among all peoples as his special possession: his love. And thanks to the prophets, Israel understood that it was again out of love that God never stopped forgiving their unfaithfulness and sins.



"The thought of my pain, my homelessness, is bitter poison. I think of it constantly, and my spirit is depressed. Yet hope returns when I remember this one thing: The Lord's unfailing love and mercy still continue, fresh as the morning, as sure as the sunrise. ... So it is best for us to wait in patience — to wait for him to save us." Lamentations 3:19-23, 26

The people were longing for the Messiah God had promised. They wanted him, they needed him, but they realized that he would come at God's own time, so they had to wait in patience and keep on hoping, as they called on the Lord to send a Saviour. Israel cried to be saved.

Christ, come quickly, there's danger at the door, poverty a-plenty, hearts gone wild with war. There's hunger in the city and famine on the plain. Come, Lord Jesus, the light is dying, the night keeps crying: Come, Lord Jesus.

22. GOD SENDS A SAVIOUR

"He will send you a prophet like me from among your own people and you are to obey him." Deut 18:15

23. THE BAPTISM OF JESUS

"I ought to be baptized by you," John said, "and yet you have come to me!" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so for now. For in this way we shall do all that God requires." So John agreed. As soon as Jesus was baptized, he came out of the water. Then heaven was opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God coming down like a dove and landing on him. Then a voice said from heaven, "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased."


Memory Verse:

Happy are those who work for peace; God will call them his children!


Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires; the Kingdom of heaven belongs to them!

- * Persecuted for doing what God requires doing what is good and right, even when others criticize us and make fun of us.



28. JESUS' TEACHING ON PRAYER


When Jesus prays he is already teaching us how to pray to his Father. But the Gospel also gives us Jesus' explicit teaching on prayer. Like a wise teacher he leads us towards the Father.

Lk: 11:5 - 10.

Tesus said to his disciples. "Suppose one of you should go to a friend's house at midnight and say." Friend, let me borrow three loaves of bread. A friend of mine who is on a trip has just come to my house, and I haven't got any food for him! And suppose your friend should answer from inside. Don't bother me! The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything. Well, what then? I tell you that even if he will not get up and give you the bread because you are his friend, yet he will get up and give you everything you need because yeu are not ashamed to keep on asking." And so I say to you. Ask, and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For those who ask will receive, and those who seek will find, and the door will be opened to anyone who knocks.

Jesus often spent time praying to the Father. In this Bible story Jesus teaches us to keep on praying and not to give up, even if we do not seem to get what we ask for. Prayer was very important to Jesus.

PRAYER IS THE TIME SPENT WITH GOD




29. JESUS' TEACHING ON FORGIVENESS. (THE FATHER FORGIVES)

Jesus was merciful toward sinners just as his Father was merciful toward them.

Scripture: Lk. 15: 11 - 32.











"This son of mine was dead, but now he is alive; he was lost, but now he has been found."

Jesus teaches us that God always forgives when we come back to him. Forgiving others and being forgiven involves being humble.

30. JESUS TEACHING ON FORGIVENESS - WE HAVE TO FORGIVE



Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, if my brother keeps on sinning against me, how many times do I have to forgive him? Seven times?"
"No, not seven times," answered Jesus, but seventy times seven."
Mt. 18:21-22a

In the parable of the unforgiving servant Jesus teaches us that God the Father forgives us. God forgives us again and again when we have sinned. He expects us to do the same. We have to forgive anyone who does wrong to us. We have to pass on to others the forgiveness God gives to us. We pray for this in the Our Father when we say,

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."



When I say,

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" I will really forgive those who have done wrong to me.

31. JESUS' TEACHING ON FAITH

"Jesus got into a boat, and his disciples went with him. Suddenly a fierce storm hit the lake, and the boat was in danger of sinking. But Jesus was asleep. The disciples went to him and woke him up. 'Save us, Lord!' they said. 'We are about to die.



"Why are you so frightened?" Jesus answered. "What little faith you have!" then he got up and ordered the winds and the waves to stop, and there was a great calm. Everyone was amazed. "What kind of man is this?" they said. "Even the winds and waves obey him."

Mt. 8:23-27

Jesus asks us to have faith in him.

Jesus is with us always.

When we turn to him, he-gives us peace.

Whatever happens to us, he is with us.

"Lord Save me".

32. JESUS WANTS US TO HAVE FAITH



"A Canaanite woman came to him. "Son of David!" she cried out. "Have mercy on me, sir! My daughter has a demon and is in a terrible condition. "But Jesus did not say a word to her. His disciples came to him and begged him, "Send her away! She is following us and making all this noise!" Then Jesus replied, "I have been sent only to the lost sheep of the people of Israel." At this the woman came and fell at his feet. "Help me, sir!" she said. Jesus answered, "It isn't right to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." "That's true, sir," she answered, "but even the dogs eat the leftovers that fall from their master's table."

So Jesus answered her, "You are a woman of great faith! What you want will be done for you." And at that very moment her daughter was healed." Mt. 15: 22 - 28

For many of His miracles Jesus expected faith.

"Seeing how much faith they had, Jesus said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Mk. 2:5

"Courage, my daughter! Your faith has made you well." Mt. 9:22.

"Don't be afraid, only believe." Mk. 5:36b


"Because they did not have faith, he did not perform many miracles there." Mt. 13: 58

33. JESUS AND HIS TEACHINGS WERE REJECTED

Toward the end of his life, Jesus gave his followers a warning: "The son of Man will be handed over to those who will kill him." Mk 9:31.

The Jewish leaders plotted to kill Jesus. Jn 11:53.



The High Priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and about his teaching. Jesus answered, "I have always spoken publicly to everyone; all my teaching was done in the synagogues and in the temple, where all the people come together. I have never said anything in secret. Why then do you question me. Ask them what I told them. — They know what I said."

When Jesus said this, one of the guards there slapped him and said, "How dare you talk like that to the High Priest!" Jesus answered him, "If I have said anything wrong, tell everyone here what it was. But if I am right in what I have said, why do you hit me?" Jn 18:19-24

Although Jesus did only good to everyone, the Jewish leaders rejected him. However, Jesus stood by the truth. He did not 'apologize' for any of his teachings or any of his works to gain the leaders' favour. He knew that he did the Father's will, and for that he was even willing to accept rejection.

If we know that we have done or said what God wanted us to do or say, we need not be afraid of anyone. Just be brave as Jesus was, and be secure in your action, even if you have to suffer for it.

34. JESUS ACCEPTED DEATH ON THE CROSS THE LAST WORDS OF JESUS

And he said to Jesus, "Remember me, Jesus, when you come as King!" Jesus said to him, "I promise you that today you will be in Paradise with me."

Lk 23:42-43.

Jesus saw his mother and the disciple he loved standing there; so he said to his mother, "He is your son" Then he said to the disciple, "She is your mother." From that time the disciple took her to live in his home.

.In 19:26-27

...in order to make the Scripture come true, he said, "I am thirsty."

Jn 19:28b

At about three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud shout, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachtani?" which means, "My God, my God, why did you abandon me?" Mt.27: 46

Jesus drank the wine and said, "It is finished!" Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Father! In your hands I place my spirit!"
He said this and died.



- He returns to his father.


-As a man Jesus, our brother, takes his place at the right hand of the Father.

37. THE HOLY SPIRIT HELPS THE CHURCH

On several occasions Christ promised to send the Holy Spirit, a promise which he fulfilled first on Easter Sunday and then more strikingly at Pentecost. Filled with the Holy Spirit the apostles began to proclaim "the mighty works of God." Those who believed in the apostolic preaching and were baptized received the gift of the Holy Spirit in their turn.



"God has raised this very Jesus from death, and we are all witnesses to this fact. He has been raised to the right-hand side of God, his Father, and has received from him the Holy Spirit, as he had promised. What you now see and hear is his gifts that he has poured out on us." Acts 2:32-33

"Many of them believed his message and were baptized, and about three thousand people were added to the group that day. They spent their time in learning from the apostles, taking part in the fellowship meals and the prayers." Acts 2:41-42

The Holy Spirit gathered the people and enabled them to believe Peter's message. The Holy Spirit enabled them to proclaim the wonderful works God has done.

As baptized Christians this is what we have to do: to come together to pray, learn more about Jesus, and share in the Eucharist.

38. THE LIFE OF THE EARLY CHRISTIANS


Acts. 4:24, 31

When they finished praying, the place where they were meeting was shaken. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to proclaim God's message with boldness.


Acts. 4: 32-35

The group of believers was one in mind and heart. None of them said that any of their belongings were their own, but they all shared with one another everything they had. With great power the apostles gave witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and God poured rich blessings on them all. There was no one in the group who was in need. Those who owned land or houses would sell them, bring the money received from the sale, and hand it over to the apostles; and the money was distributed according to the needs of the people.



The believers who were scattered went everywhere, preaching the message. Acts. 8: 4

39. THE FORMATION OF THE EARLY CHURCH



As the number of disciples kept growing, there was a quarrel between the Greek-speaking Jews and the native Jews. The Greek-speaking Jews claimed that their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of funds. So the twelve apostles called the whole group of believers together and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the preaching of God's Word in order to handle finances. So then, friends, choose seven men among you who are known to be full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, and we will put them in charge of this matter. We ourselves, then, will give our full time to prayer and the work of preaching.

The whole group was pleased with the apostles proposal, so they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a Gentile from Antioch who had earlier been converted to Judaism. The group presented them to the apostles, who prayed and placed their hands on them. - And so the Word of God continued to spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem grew larger, and a great number of priests accepted the faith." Acts. 6:1-7.

The apostles saw preaching, teaching and praying as their main work which is also the main work of the priests. Other members of the Church do different kinds of work. (Teachers, nurses, looking after the poor and children.)

40. THE HOLY EUCHARIST, OUR THANKSGIVING

(Lesson 1)

The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father for all the blessings which we receive, for creation, redemption and sanctification.

Eucharist means "thanksgiving".


It is good to give thanks to the Lord.






42. THE EUCHARIST--SACRAMENT OF UNITY

"The cup we use in the Lord's Supper and for which we give thanks to God: when we drink from it, we are sharing in the blood o Christ. And the bread we break: when we eat it, we are sharing in the body of Christ. Because there is the one loaf of bread, all of us, though many, are one body, for we all share the same loaf." ICor.10:16-17

The Eucharist makes the Church.
Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ.
Through the Eucharist Christ unites all the faithful into one body - the Church.

Jesus prayed:

"That they may all be one. As you Father are in Me and I am in You, may they also be one in Us." Jn 17:21



What happens to us, when we, each one of us, receive the body and blood of Christ?

The Eucharist joins us, unites us, makes us one. Just as many grains of wheat become flour for one loaf of bread, so in the Eucharist, we become the one body of Christ.

By being kind to others, I will show that I am one with Jesus and one with others.

43. THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE


There is a need and desire for reconciliation in our lives.

When we go to confession

- 1. We acknowledge that we have sinned and need to be reconciled with God.
- 2. We are sorry for our sins.
- 3. We go to the priest and confess our sins.

In the Sacrament of Penance God the good Father welcomes his children. Through the priest, we receive God's forgiveness.

The <u>penance</u> we do, shows our willingness to do our part in repairing the harm caused by our sins. Through this penance we unite ourselves with Jesus who has suffered for our sins.



O my God, I am very sorry that I have sinned against you, because you are so good, and with your help I will try not to sin again. Amen.

I will receive the Sacrament of Penance regularly to renew and strengthen my relationship with God my Father.

44. THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

1 Cor 15:3-4 "I passed on to you what I received, which is of the greatest importance: that Christ died for our sins, as written in the Scriptures; that he was buried and that he was raised to life three days later, as written in the Scriptures."



When the priest gives us <u>absolution</u>, he says "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

In the Sacrament. of Reconciliation we receive God's pardon and peace.

The steps for Confession:

- 1. Pray to the Holy Spirit. Think of your sins.
- 2. Be sorry for your sins and make up your mind not to sin again.
- 3. Confess your sins to the priest.
- 4. Receive Absolution.
- Do your penance.

CATECHISM:

9. (57) What does the priest say in the sacrament of reconciliation when he gives Absolution?

WHEN THE PRIEST GIVES ABSOLUTION HE SAYS "I ABSOLVE YOU FROM YOUR SINS IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT."

45. PARA - LITURGY OF RECONCILIATION

A suitable quiet place (church, chapel--not classroom if possible), A crucifix in centre. Children for reading and Reconciliation Prayers. Groups to stand for the "Response".

OPENING HYMN: Father, I have sinned

PRAYER: Father, we have turned away from you and disobeyed you. We have sinned. But you are waiting for us to come back to you because you love us. Father, we come to you now and ask you to forgive us.

READING: Ps 51: 1a, 2, 3, 4a, 7, 8a, 10.

Each verse is read by a different child.

At the end of each verse a flower is placed near the crucifix--by the reader, another selected child or volunteers.

RELECTION:

A time of quiet. (With soft music if possible). Teacher softly asks slowly the questions.

- --When was a time I went my own way?
- --When did I not say a word to defend others who were accused?
- --Who is someone I don't care about?
- --What lies have I told?
- -- Do I always do what God wants me to do?
- -- Can God say to me "I am pleased with you"?

Jesus has suffered for our sins. Let us pray for God's forgiveness.

(Children are seated around the crucifix Each time the response is sung, one of the 7 groups stands as a sign of willingness to "get up and return" to the Father.)

RECONCILIATION:

Response: Yes I shall arise and return to my Father.

- For the times I have turned from God and walked my own way, I am sorry. Res.
- 2. For the time my words have hurt and humiliated others I am sorry. Res.
- For the times others have been hurt or neglected because I have not cared for them, I am sorry. Res.
- 4. For my untruthfulness and dishonesty, I am sorry. Res.

- 5. For the times I have not done the good others have asked me for, I am sorry. Res.
- For the times my actions have displeased God and turned me from Him, I am sorry. Res.
- Because Jesus has suffered and died that I might return to my Father I say. Res.

Leader: Let us confess together that we are the ones who have sinned and been brought back to the Father through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

All: I confess to Almighty God. (in prayer section)

Leader: Let us show our reconciliation to the Father by being reconciled to each other. Let us share a sign of peace and unity as we say "Our Father."

Leader: We pray that the Father will bless us, keep us from all evil and bring us to life everlasting.

CLOSING HYMN:

It is good to give thanks to the Lord. (or another thanksgiving Hymn).

46. PRAYER

The simplest prayer is to say the name of "Jesus" reverently.

Our prayer is a response to God's call to be with him.

47. A WAY OF PRAYING WITH THE BIBLE

Luke 18:35-43

Read the story twice, so that the story is well understood. For the third time, one student reads the same story, putting him/herself in the place of the blind man:

As Jesus was coming near Jericho, there was I, (a blind man) begging. When I heard the crowd passing by, I asked, "What is this?" "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by," they told me. I cried out, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me."

The people in front scolded me and told me to be quiet. But I shouted even more loudly, "Son of David! Have pity on me!"

So Jesus stopped and ordered me, (the blind man) to be brought to him. When I came near, Jesus asked me, "What do you want me to do for you?" "Sir", I answered, "I want to see again."

Jesus said to me, "Then see! Your faith has made you well."

At once I was able to see, and I followed Jesus, giving thanks to God. When the crowd saw it, they all praised God."

Several students have a turn in reading the same story in the same way. Then each student reads the story again in the same way. Spend a few minutes in silent prayer. Encourage students to express their response to this way of praying. (Imagine yourself to be the blind man)

- 1. How did you feel begging at the side of the road?
- 2. What did you think when you heard that Jesus was approaching?
- 3. What did you do?
- 4. Did you worry about what the people said?
- Then Jesus called you. Tell us, what happened from there on and how you felt.
- 6. What was your response?

Finish with a song of praise. 'O how good is the Lord.'



48. A WAY OF QUIET PRAYER

Prayer keeps our faith alive.
Prayer is remembering God. We must remember God more often than we draw breath. But we cannot pray "at all times" if we do not pray at specific times, wanting to pray.

Read Mk 6:31

"There were so many people coming and going that Jesus and his disciples didn't even have time to eat. So he said to them, "Let us go off by ourselves to some place where we will be alone and you can rest a while."

Try this way of prayer. It will be a quiet way of praying, just being with Jesus.

Prepare a quiet place, carefully decorated with a picture or a cross, flowers, candle. Sing softly and slowly:



Father I adore you, lay my life before you, how I love you. Jesus I adore you, lay my life before you, how I love you. Spirit I adore you, lay my life before you, how I love you.

Sit up straight, quietly, hands resting loosely opened on knees, eyes closed, breathing in and out slowly saying: "In"..... "Out".....

Continue this for a short time (not more than a minute).

After a short space, repeat this quiet process.

For the third time use prayer words as you breathe in and out slowly.

JE _ (breathe in) SUS. (breathe out).

49. GOD IS AMONG US IN THE COMMUNITY






God is with us. The signs of God's presence may not be always clear. If we have faith we will be aware and see God present and at work in our community.

She answered, "By the living Lord your God I swear that I haven't got any bread. All I have is a handful of flour and a bit of olive oil in a jar. I came here to gather some firewood and prepare what little I have for my son and me, and then we will die."

"Don't worry," Elijah said to her.
"Go and prepare your meal. But first make a small loaf from what

you have and bring it to me, and then prepare the rest for you and your son. God says, "The bowl will not run out of flour, or the jar run out of oil before I send rain."

The widow did as Elijah had told her, and all of them had enough food for many days.

When she realized what had happened, she said, "Now I know that the Lord really speaks through you."

The woman realized that God came to her through Elijah who needed help, and it was God who helped her through Elijah.


Christ now lives and acts in and with his Church. He acts through the

Initiation:

The faithful are <u>born anew</u> by Baptism, <u>strengthened</u> by the Sacrament of Confirmation, and <u>receive</u> in the Eucharist the <u>food</u> of eternal life."

Healing:

"The Lord Jesus Christ, has willed that his Church continue, his work of healing and salvation. This is the purpose of the two sacraments of healing.

Service:

Two sacraments are directed towards the salvation of others. They give a particular service for mission in the Church to build up the People of God.

53. GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH THE SCRIPTURES

In Sacred Scripture, God the Father meets his children.

"Remember that ever since you were a child, you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching the truth, rebuking error, correcting faults, and giving instruction for right living." 2 Tim 3:15-16



"How can they call to him for help if they have not believed? And how can they believe if they have not heard the message? And how can they hear if the message is not proclaimed? And how can the message be proclaimed if the messages are not sent out?" Rom 10:14-15a

"Some men came from Judea and Antioch and started teaching the believers, "You cannot be saved unless you are circumcised as the law of Moses requires." Paul and Barnabas got into a fierce argument with them about this, so it was decided that Paul and Barnabas and some of the others in Antioch should go to Jerusalem and see the apostles and elders about this matter."

After a long debate Peter stood up and said, "My friends, you know that a long time ago God chose me from among you to preach the Good News to the Gentiles so that they could hear and believe. The Holy Spirit and we have agreed not to put any other burden on you besides these necessary rules..... Acts 15:1-2, 7, 28

Anyone who wants to preach the Good News has to be sent by the Bishop. The Bishop is the official teacher in the Church. Parish priests share in his teaching ministry and guide and direct others who help in this ministry. The parish priest has authority from the Bishop to direct those who work in the parish.



55. BY BAPTISM WE BECOME MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH

Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life. It opens the door for us to receive the other sacraments.

Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons and daughters of God. We become members of the Church and so we share in her mission. The promises we make at Baptism are for life.

56. WE LIVE THE FAITH WE PROFESS AT BAPTISM



Peter preaches and baptizes:

"Peter stood up with the other eleven apostles and in a loud voice began to speak to the crowd: 'Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem. listen to me and let me tell you what this means.' Acts 2:14, "Jesus of Nazareth was a man whose divine authority was clearly proven to you by all the miracles and wonders which God performed through him. You vourselves know this, for it happened here among you. In accordance with his own plan God had already decided that Jesus would be handed over to you; and you killed him by letting sinful men crucify him. But God raised him from death, setting him free from its power, because it was impossible that death should hold him prisoner." Acts 2: 22-24. "When the people heard this they were deeply troubled and said to Peter and the other apostles, 'What shall we do, brothers?" Acts 2:37 "Many of them believed his message and were baptized, and about three thousand people were added to the group that day. They spent their time in learning from the apostles, taking part in the fellowship, and sharing in the fellowship meals and the prayers." Acts 2:41-42.

In our baptismal promises we have expressed our faith. We are committed to live what we believe.

By living my Baptismal Promises I become a faithful member of God's holy people, the Church.

57. WE LIVE AS MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH

"Just as Baptism is the source of responsibilities and duties, the baptized person also enjoys rights within the Church:

- * to receive the sacraments
- * to be nourished by the Word of God
- * to be strengthened by the other spiritual helps of the Church.

As members of the Church we have a right to all these helps. It is up to each one of us to make use of these helps and request them.



"God our Father, these children of yours have been enlightened by Christ. They are to walk always as children of the Light. May they keep the flame of faith alive in their hearts. When the Lord comes may they go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom."

58. THE HOLY SPIRIT DIRECTS OUR LIVES

"What I say is this: let the Spirit direct your lives, and you will not satisfy the desires of the human nature....The Spirit produces love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility and self-control. There is no law against such things as these. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have put to death their human nature with all its passions and desires. The Spirit has given us life; he must also control our lives. We must not be proud or irritate one another or be jealous of one another." Gal 5:16, 22-26

In Confirmation we receive the Holy Spirit who helps us to change our lives. By our actions we can help others to let the Holy Spirit work in them also.



By Confirmation the Holy Spirit strengthens me to live a holy life, proclaim the Gospel and love others as Jesus did.

61. LITURGY – OUR PARTICIPATION IN THE WORK OF GOD

"The word 'liturgy' originally meant a 'public work' or a service on behalf of the people. In Christian tradition it means the participation of the People of God in 'the work of God.' Through the Liturgy Christ, our redeemer and high priest, continues the work of our redemption, with and through his Church." CCC 1069

"When you have harvested your crops, celebrate this festival for seven days, beginning on the fifteenths day of the seventh month. The first day shall be a special day of rest. On that day take some of the best fruit from your trees, take paim branches and branches of leafy trees, and begin a religious festival to honour the Lord your God. Celebrate it for seven days, so that your descendants may know that the Lord made the people of Israel live in simple shelters when he led them out of Egypt. He is the Lord your God." Lev. 23: 39-43

Celebrating together is an important means of helping us remember the great works of God and participate in them.
This is what we mean by Liturgy.

62. OUR ROLE IN THE LITURGY

Vat.2 on the Liturgy:

"In the celebration of the Liturgy, full and active participation by all the people is the aim before all else.

Servers, readers, choir have a very special role.

There should be time for both song and silence.

Sacred Readings are an essential part of all liturgy.

Our Liturgy is not a "show" or "concert". Songs and actions should highlight the meaning of the feast.

More important feasts like Easter and Christmas should be well prepared and celebrated with special songs and decorations.

Everyone present should join in prayers, songs, responses.

Liturgy is the action of the whole people of God Liturgy means: An action, the work of the people,—our way of showing as a community we serve and worship God.

Memorize:

Liturgy is the official, public worship of the Church.



63. LITURGICAL SEASONS


The Church, in the course of the year, celebrates the whole mystery of Christ from his Incarnation and Nativity through his Ascension, to Pentecost and the expectation of the second coming of the Lord.



By celebrating the feasts of the saints – first of all the Holy Mother of God, then the apostles, the martyrs and other saints – on fixed days of the Liturgical year, the Church on earth shows that she is united with the liturgy of heaven.

She gives glory to Christ for having accomplished his salvation in his glorified members, the saints. Their example encourages her on her way to the Father.

64. THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK (1)



<Jesus got into the boat and went back across the lake to his own town, where some people brought to him a paralyzed man, lving on a bed. When Jesus saw how much faith they had, he said to the paralyzed man, "Courage, my son! Your sins are foraiven." Then some teachers of the law said to themselves, "This man is speaking blasphemy!"

Jesus perceived what they were thinking, and so he said, "Why are you thinking such evil things? Is it easier to say, "Your sins are forgiven," or to say, "Get up and walk?" I will prove to you, then, that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." So he said to the paralyzed man, "Get up, pick up your bed, and go home!"


The man got up and went home. When the people saw it, they were afraid, and praised God for giving such authority to people.> Mt 9:1-8

Through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Jesus continues his work of healing the sick and forgiving their sins. Jesus now acts through the priest who anoints the sick person.

65. THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK (2)

"Even though our physical being is gradually decaying, yet our spiritual being is renewed day after day. And this small and temporary trouble we suffer will bring us a tremendous and eternal glory, much greater than the trouble. For we fix our attention, not on things that are seen, but on things that are unseen. What can be seen lasts only for a time, but what cannot be seen lasts for ever. 2 Cor 4: 16b-18





We experience suffering similar to Paul's.

Through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Jesus gives us the strength, peace and courage to suffer our illness or old age in a Christian manner. If we remain united with Jesus in our sufferings we can help ourselves and the Church.

66. THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK (3)

"Are any among you sick? They should send for the church elders, who will pray for them and rub olive oil on them in the name of the Lord. This prayer made in faith will heal the sick; the Lord will restore them to health, and the sins they have committed will be forgiven." James 5:14-15

The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is to:

- unite the sick person with the sufferings of Jesus
- give strength, peace, and courage to the sick person
- forgive sins
- restore to health if God wants it
- prepare for eternal life






67. THE CALL TO PRIESTHOOD






Man and woman leave their parents and become husband and wife. It is in God's plan that husband and wife love each other and have children. Married couples should make the world a better place.

Her children show their appreciation, and her husband praises her. He says, 'Many women are good wives, but you are the best of them all.' Prov. 31:10-


To live a happy married life, husband and wife have to make efforts to show their love, respect and appreciation of each other.



77. SIXTH AND NINTH COMMANDMENTS

The story of Maria Goretti.

Maria was a beautiful twelve year old Italian girl. Her father had died leaving her mother and the young family without support. To provide for her family, Maria's mother went to live with a family of friends. They had a farm and the two families worked together in the fields each day. A boy in the friend's family, Alessandro, liked Maria and wanted her. One day when Maria was alone in the house. Alessandro came to her and tried to make her sleep with him. Maria knew what Alessandro asked for, was wrong. She loved God and did not want to disobey him. So she refused, saving, it was a sin. After that Maria made sure she was never alone when Alessandro was around.



When harvest time came everyone had to go to the fields. Maria was left home to care for the baby. When Alessandro saw that Maria was not in the field he slowly returned to the house. He carne in and forced Maria to the ground. She kept calling out, "No Alessandro! No! It is a sin! I love God and I do not want to disobey Him!"


Alessandro became so angry, he pulled out a knife and stabbed Maria fourteen times. He ran from the house leaving her bleeding on the floor. Her mother found her there when she returned to the house. Maria was rushed, in an old wooden cart, along a very bumpy road, to the hospital. She died two days later saying, "I forgive Alessandro. I want him to be happy in heaven".

That happened in 1902. In 1950 Maria was named St Maria Goretti. Alessandro was also there and spoke of what he had done. Maria's prayers helped Alessandro to change his life and to ask God for forgiveness. She is the special patron of boys and girls. She can help us to be pure as she was. Her feast is celebrated on 6th July.

The Sixth Commandment: You shall not commit adultery.

The Ninth Commandment: You shall not covet your neighbors wife.


80. JESUS GAVE US A NEW COMMANDMENT


Our conscience is always at work within us helping us to use our freedom wisely. As small children we did what we were told. We depended on others to tell us what to do. We imitated others too.

89. WE ARE CALLED TO HOLINESS


All Christians are called to holiness:

90. BLESSED KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, Saint of the Mohawks.

When the great continent of the Americas was discovered by the European explorer Christoper Columbus it was the home of a great number of warring Indian tribes. One of the fiercest of these was the Mohawks. In 1656 the daughter of one of their fierce, pagan warriors was born. Many years later, in baptism she took the name of Kateri.

When Kateri was four years old, her mother died of the dreadful disease small pox. Kateri also got the disease and it badly disfigured her face. She was taken into the home of her two aunts and uncle. Because they knew it would be difficult for her to get married they were very unkind to her and treated her like a slave. Kateri did not seem to mind. She was always cheerful and did whatever she had to do because Kateri wanted something and she had to find a way to get it.

The Jesuit missionaries had come preaching about Jesus to the Indian Tribes. Although some were killed by the Indians others took their place. Kateri listened to them and wanted to know more about the man Jesus. As often as she could when her work was done, she went to listen and then to just sit quietly and think about and talk to this Man-God, Jesus.

Her aunts and uncle did not approve of these strange missionaries and made it difficult for Kateri to visit their area. But even with extra work, beatings and their constant complaints Kateri still managed to make time to go to early morning Mass and to hear more about Jesus and the woman Mary who was his mother and hers.

The missionaries noticed her and at first left her alone but later began to talk to her and so heard her story. When Kateri told how her family refused to let her be baptized the priest talked about taking this unmarriageable girl off their hands. The aunts and uncle finally agreed even though it meant they would lose a good worker. They realized that Kateri was not very strong and would not serve them much longer.

Kateri went to the new mission colony in Canada. When she was twenty she was baptized. Every morning, even in the very cold Canadian winter, she got up early and went to the Church for Mass. Often the door was not yet opened so she just stood and waited.

The people at the mission colony came to love this gentle, joyful Indian young woman. She was always willing to help and to care for the young children. They did not have her very long. In 1680, when she was twenty four years old, Kateri died. Her last words were "Jesus, Mary, I love you". Even though she was not treated very well by her own people and died away from them, she is now called Kateri of the Mohawks.

91. SAINT PETER AND SAINT JOHN

Narrator:

Soon after Pentecost, Peter and John cured the paralyzed man by calling on the power of the name of Jesus. The people were very excited and thousands were becoming believers.

The Jewish Leaders were very cross and jealous and put Peter and John in jail for preaching about Jesus.

<u>Jewish Leader 1</u>: Go and bring those two Galileans here! (Peter and John are brought in.)

<u>High Priest:</u> How did you cure this man? What power have you got or whose name did you use?

Peter: Leaders of the people and elders! You should know, and all the people of Israel should know, that this man stands here completely well through the power of the name of Jesus of Nazareth. You crucified him but God raised him from death. Salvation is to be found from him alone.

Jewish Leader 2: How can these people speak like this?

Jewish Leader 1: They are ordinary men with no education.

High Priest: Take them outside while we discuss the case.

Jewish Leader 3: What shall we do with these men?

<u>Jewish Leader 4</u>: Everyone in Jerusalem knows this miracle happened and we cannot deny it.

<u>High Priest:</u> To keep this matter from spreading any further we will warn these men **never again** to speak to anyone in the name of Jesus.


Narrator: So they called them back in and told them strictly not to speak or teach in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John answered:

<u>Peter and John:</u> You yourselves judge which is right in God's sight – to obey you or to obey God. For we cannot stop speaking of what we ourselves have seen and heard.

<u>High Priest:</u> We are giving you a serious warning. If you don't obey us you will be in worse trouble.

Narrator:

As soon as Peter and John were set free they returned to their group and told them what the chief priests and elders had said.



Peter and John were filled with the Holy Spirit and love for Jesus. This gave them courage to speak up boldly and obey God rather than men.

It is sometimes easier to do what people want than to do what God wants, especially if we are afraid of getting into trouble.

The Holy Spirit and our love for Jesus strengthen us to be as courageous as Peter and John were, and to become saints.

We receive the life of God at Baptism.


Mary had the fullness of God's life from the moment she was conceived.



These then will be sent off to eternal punishment, but the righteous will go to eternal life." Mt 25: 31-34, 41, 46

When Jesus comes, he will:

- -gather all the people
- -divide them into two groups

God has prepared a place for everyone in the Kingdom of heaven. We are not made for hell. The devil and his angels chose to separate themselves from God. Only those people who themselves choose to go against God will be separated from him forever. This is the punishment of hell. They will never have life and happiness with God.

This is how St. Paul talks about <u>heaven</u>: "No eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him." 1Cor 2:9

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are saved; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name <u>Purgatory</u> to this final purification.

To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from God for ever by our own free choice. This reality is called <u>hell.</u>

When Our Lady appeared to the children at Fatima in 1917, she taught them this prayer:

O Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fire of hell, bring all souls to heaven, especially those who most need your mercy.

We say this prayer after each decade of the Rosary.

I will choose God. His way and my place in His Kingdom

100. WE PREPARE FOR THE LORD'S COMING Advent (1)

Advent is a special time of preparation for the coming of Jesus. We prepare for the celebration of his first coming, when he was born in Bethlehem. But we also remember that we are preparing every day for his second coming in glory.



"A voice cries out, 'Prepare in the wilderness a road for the Lord! Clear the way in the desert for our God! Fill every valley; level every mountain. The hills will become a plain, and the rough country will be made flat." Is 40:3-4

The prophet Isaiah says,

- -prepare a way in the wilderness
- -clear the way in the desert
- -fill every valley
- -level every mountain

"So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. Turn away from your sins and be baptized,' he told the people, 'and God will forgive your sins.' He announced to the people, 'The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and untie his sandals."

Mk 1:4, 7

John says we have to

- -turn away from our sins
- -be baptized

Song: Ev'ry valley shall be exalted and ev'ry hill made low. And all God's people shall see together the glory of the Lord. A voice cries out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight in the desert a highway, a highway for our God.



In Advent I will make an effort to change what needs to be changed in me to be ready for Jesus' coming.

101. HOW DO WE PREPARE OURSELVES FOR THE LORD'S COMING? (Advent 2)

"The people asked John,
'What are we to do then?'
He answered,
'Whoever has two shirts must give
one to the man who has none, and
whoever has food must share it.'

Some tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what are we to do?' 'Don't collect more than is legal," he told them.

Some soldiers also asked him, 'What about us? What are we to do? He said to them, 'Don't take money from anyone by force or accuse anyone falsely. Be content with your pay." Lk 3:10-14, 18.




If we would ask John, "What are we to do?"

We should prepare ourselves to meet the Lord and to become "a people well disposed." The preparation of our hearts is the joint work of the Holy Spirit and ours. The grace of the Holy Spirit strengthens our faith, helps us to repent and to do the Father's will.

102. JESUS COMES AS THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD (Advent 3)



"The Word was the source of life, and this life brought light to people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never put it out.

God sent his messenger, a man named John, who came

God sent his messenger, a man named John, who came to tell people about the light, so that all should hear the message and believe. He himself was not the light, he came to tell about the light that comes into the world and shines on all people."

John 1:4-9

The world was in the darkness of sin. Jesus came as the light of the world. He is stronger than the darkness of sin.
If we follow Jesus, we too become light and can overcome sin.

To remind us that Jesus is the light, the Church uses candles or other lights when celebrating



Advent and Christmas. Sometimes an Advent wreath with four candles is used. One candle is lit on the first Sunday, two on the second,.....

The better we prepare ourselves, the more we become light for the Community.

Songs: This little light of mine, I'm going to let it shine. (3x) Let it shine(3x).

103. CHRISTMAS (1)


Most of these texts were written long before Jesus was born.

104. CHRISTMAS (2)




Joseph Lk 2:4 - 5a. Joseph went from the town of Nazareth to the town of Bethlehem, the birthplace of King David. Joseph went there because he was a descendant of David. He went to register with Mary, who was promised in marriage to him.

Mary Lk 2:5b-7. She was pregnant, and while they were in Bethlehem, she gave birth to her first son, wrapped

him in strips of cloth and laid him in a manger – there was no room for them to stay in the inn.

Shepherds Lk 2: 8 – 18, 20. There were some shepherds in that part of the country who were spending the night out in the open, taking care of their flocks. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone over them. They were terribly afraid, but the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid! I am

here with good news for you, which will bring great joy to all the people. This very day in David's town your Saviour was born -Christ the Lord! And this is what will



prove it to you: you will find a baby wrapped in strips of cloth and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great army of heaven's angels appeared with the first angel, singing praises to God: "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace on earth to those with whom he is pleased!"

When the angels went away from them back into heaven, the

shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph and saw the baby lying in the manger. When the shepherds saw him, they told them what the angel had said about the child. All who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said.

Mary Lk 2:19. Mary remembered all these things and thought deeply about them.

Shepherds Lk 2:20. The shepherds went back, singing praises to God for all they had heard and seen; it had been just as the angel had told them.

105. LITURGY ASH-WEDNESDAY

Enter church or classroom singing **Yes, I shall arise and return to my Father.**. (Gather around fire)

First reading: Esther. 4:1-3

"When Mordecai learnt of all that had been done, he tore his clothes in anguish. Then he dressed in sackcloth, covered his head with ashes, and walked through the city, wailing loudly and bitterly, until he came to the entrance of the palace. He did not go in because no one wearing sackcloth was allowed inside. Throughout all the provinces, wherever the king's proclamation was made known, there was loud mourning among the Jews. They fasted, wept, wailed, and most of them put on sackcloth and lay in ashes."

Jesus, Lord, I ask for mercy.

Second reading: Neh. 9:1-2

"On the twenty-fourth day of the same month the people of Israel gathered to fast in order to show sorrow for their sins. They had already separated themselves from all foreigners. They wore sackcloth and put dust on their heads as signs of grief. Then they stood and began to confess the sins that they and their ancestors had committed."

Jesus, Lord, I ask for mercy.

Third reading: Jn 3:4-6

"How can a grown man be born again?" Nicodemus asked. "He certainly cannot enter his mother's womb and be born a second time?" "I am telling you the truth," replied Jesus. "No one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit. A person is born physically of human parents, but is born spiritually of the Spirit."

Jesus, Lord, ! ask for mercy.

REFLECTION: Ashes have always been an important symbol of sadness and sorrow for all people.

First child holds flashcard - <u>Sadness</u>. Second child - <u>Sorrow for sin</u>. Third child - <u>Repentance, change</u>.

Ashes are used for sadness, sorrow for sin and as a sign of readiness to change. These are the things we are called to do for Lent so we begin this season with Ash Wednesday - a day when we put ashes on our foreheads to admit our sinfulness and our willingness to change. For the next forty

days we put away our symbols of rejoicing - Alleluia and continue to ask for forgiveness. To help us be faithful in Lent we pray.

Response: Lord help us to remember.

Leader:

Lent is a time for remembering God's love for us (Res).

Lent is a time for looking at what Jesus has done for us (Res).

Lent is a time for turning back to God. (Res). Lent is a time of prayer and penance. (Res).

Lent is a time when we walk with Jesus in the desert. (Res).

Lent is a time of new life and renewed giving. (Res).

Distribution of Ashes.

Song: Lenten song sung in the parish

Prayer: God our Father you gave us Jesus your son to be our way to you. In these forty days of Lent, help us to walk with Him and to show our love for you by the way we live. May our prayers, works and actions help us become more like Jesus who lives with you and the Holy Spirit forever. Amen.

Conclusion: Carry fire container to classroom as hymn is sung.

106. LENT - LITURGY

(Half way through Lent).

ENTRANCE:

Song: Yes, I shall arise and return to my Father.

TEACHER:

On Ash Wednesday we began the 40 days of Lent. Today we have completed half of them. It is time to look at what we have done and what we are going to do during the second half of Lent.

READING: Luke 9:43b-45

"The people were still marveling at everything Jesus was doing when he said to his disciples, 'Don't forget what I am about to tell you! The Son of Man is going to be handed over to the power of human beings." But the

disciples did not know what this meant. It had been hidden from them so that they could not understand it, and they were afraid to ask him about the matter."

INTERCESSIONS:

Let us pray that we and all Christians may have the Faith, courage and strength to work with and for Jesus in the last half of Lent.

Leader:

Lord Jesus we believe that you have invited us to go with you to Jerusalem where you will enter into death and glory. So that we may always be ready to walk with you, we pray.

Response: Let us go to Jerusalem to suffer and rise with Him.

Leader:

- Lord Jesus, you went up to Jerusalem to do all your Father asked of you.
 May we always be ready to put God first in our lives. (Res)
- 2) Lord Jesus, you went up to Jerusalem so that all people would come to know the Father's love. May we always show that love to others. (Res)
- 3) Lord Jesus, you went up to Jerusalem so that when lifted up you would draw all people to yourself. May all we do bring us closer to you. (Res)
- Lord Jesus, you went up to Jerusalem so that from your heart would flow living water. Fill us with your spirit so that we might bring your life to others. (Res)
- 5) Lord Jesus, you went up to Jerusalem to suffer, die and rise again. Help us to share your suffering so that we may share your joy and glory. (Res)

LEADER:

Let us pray to the Father who brought Jesus through death to life: Our Father (said or sung)

Sing: Final hymn while children place number strip (21-40) in classroom.

Keep in mind

Keep in mind that Jesus Christ has died for us; and is risen from the dead. He is our saving Lord; He is joy for all ages.

- 1 If we die with the Lord, We shall live with the Lord.
- 2 If we endure with the Lord, We shall reign with the Lord.

- 4. In Him, hope of glory, In Him, all our love.

107. HOLY THURSDAY

Scripture: Jn 13:1,3-10,12-15

"It was now the day before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. He had always loved those in the world who were his own, and he loved them to the very end. - Jesus knew that the Father had given him complete power; he knew that he had come from God and was going to God. So he rose from the table, took off his outer garment. and fied a towel around his waist. Then he poured some water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel around his waist. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Are you going to wash my feet, Lord?" Jesus answered him. "You do not understand now what I am doing, but you will understand later." Peter declared, "Never at any time will you wash my feet." "If I do not wash your feet, "Jesus answered, "you will no longer be my disciple." Simon Peter answered, "Lord, do not wash only my feet, then. Wash my hands and head too." Jesus said, "Those who have had a bath are completely clean and do not have to wash themselves except their feet. All of you are clean - except one." After Jesus had washed their feet, he put his outer garment back on and returned to his place at the table. "Do you understand what I have just done to you?" he asked. "You call me Teacher and Lord, and it is right that you do so, because that is what I am. I, your Lord and Teacher, have just washed your feet. You, then, should wash one another's feet. I have set an example for you so that you will do just what I have done for you,"

On Holy Thursday Jesus set an example for us.



We have to show our love for others by serving them.

108. HOLY THURSDAY LITURGY

OPENING:

Song: This is my body (lesson 41)

READING:.

"For I received from the Lord the teaching that I passed on to you: that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took a piece of bread, gave thanks to God, broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in memory of me." In the same way, after the supper he took the cup and said, "This cup is God's new covenant, sealed with my blood. Whenever you drink it, do so in memory of me." 1 Cor. 11:23-25

RESPONSE: Thank you Jesus.

One student of the group reads the lines

Jesus: Lord Jesus, you gave yourself for us.

Jesus, you took our human nature to be like us.

Jesus, you took our sins to make us children of the Father.

Broke: Jesus, you broke the power of evil in our lives.

Jesus, you were broken so that we could be healed.

For you: Jesus, everything you did was for us.

Jesus, you gave yourself at the supper and on the cross for

US.

RESPONSE: Help us to be like you

You: Jesus, you ask us to give ourselves to others as you did.

Jesus, you ask us to live as you did.

Do this: Love one another as I have loved you.

In memory: We want to serve others in memory of you, Jesus.

Song: By this shall people know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another.....

We have to show our love for others by serving them.

109.-110. GOOD FRIDAY



STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

Sing: God of Mercy and compassion (Ch).

Jesus Lord, I ask for mercy let me not implore in vain.

All the things I now detest them never will I sin again.

PRAYER:

Lord as we walk this way with you help us to remember the people who today continue to carry your cross in their lives. Help us to be always ready to do what we can to share their burden.

STATION 1: Jesus is condemned to death. (Put up picture.)

At each station:

Leader: We adore you, Christ, and we bless you,

All: because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the

world.

Leader: Pilate washed his hands to show he did not want to be part of Jesus' death, but he did not raise his hands to protect Him. Today when I refuse to speak the truth or speak out to help others, I am like Pilate washing my hands, but closing my heart.

At each station:

Response: Jesus help me to open my hands to you and others.

STATION 2: Jesus takes His Cross. (Put up picture)

The soldiers passed the cross to Jesus. He took it and put it on His shoulder. So often my cross comes to me from the hands of others. But I don't always put my hands out to take it as Jesus did.

STATION 3: Jesus falls the first time.

Jesus fell and rough hands pulled and pushed Him until He was up and on His way again. I often see people fall. So often my hands are the rough hands of the soldiers, not the gentle hands of Jesus who reached out to touch others in friendship and healing.

STATION 4: Jesus meets His mother.

Mary's hands went out to help but other hands kept her away. Because of fear and shame I let others turn me from helping those who need help. At times I have stopped others from being helping hands.

STATION 5: Simon helps Jesus to carry the cross.

More helping hands as Simon lifts the load off Jesus' shoulders. Everyday there is the chance for me to be Simon to my parents, teachers, friends. To be like Simon means to be unselfish and generous.

STATION 6: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

Strong hands, gentle hands. Brave hands to wipe Jesus' face. My hands can help to wipe the sorrow and shame from others when I have the courage to act for them.

STATION 7: Jesus falls a second time.

Even Simon's hands were not enough. Again Jesus fell. There are never enough hands to help. Everyone needs help at some time. When my hands reach out to others, someone is able to rise and go on.

STATION 8: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.

The women's tears didn't really help. It was Jesus who reached his hands out to them. His words gave them courage. It doesn't matter how small my help is. The important thing is that I am ready to help others.

STATION 9: Jesus falls the third time.

Almost at the end and He falls again. No hands to help. Where are my hands when people really need me? At the end of a day there is always someone who needs hands to help finish off.

STATION 10: Jesus stripped of His clothes.

Many strong, willing hands to pull and tear. When I talk about others I do the same. When I steal I do the same. My hands are not always gentle, loving hands.

STATION 11: Jesus nailed to the Cross.

Strong, cruel hands that hold a hammer and hit in nails. My hands hold those nails when my words are hard, my words untrue. I too nail others to the cross and cause them pain by so much that I say to and about them.

STATION 12: Jesus Dies on the Cross. (Pause for a while)

Hands stretched out and open to give all He has for us. My hands are closed and folded when I refuse to give. Jesus asks me to open my hands to all who ask for my help and my love.

STATION 13: Jesus taken down from the Cross.

So many gentle, loving hands to take out the nails, wash and hold Jesus. Today Jesus needs all those hands again to show love and kindness to those who suffer.

STATION 14: Jesus laid in the Tomb.

The hands of friends carry Him to the grave, wrap Him in a cloth and lay Him to rest. Love and understanding make our hands gentle and kind. We can reach out to others who need help. We can touch them with our love.

CONCLUSION: Jesus used His hands to heal and save us. Let us pray as He taught us that we might give to Him as the Father gives to us. Our Father.

CLOSING SONG: Were you there



CELEBRATION:


March or process to the prayer corner.

Give a sign of peace – as done in your Church in your area.





We all know how strong the "wantok" system is.

What does being a "wantok" mean?

What do you expect a "wantok" to do for you?

Jesus wanted all people to be "wantoks". He told us, God is our Father and He prayed that all may be one.

Let us think of all the people Jesus gives us as "wantoks" in God's family.

Children arrange different faces around the center piece (Cross, candle etc.) as all sing: Make me your brother...

Several children say something about the face they have displayed.

1st Child: I am an Arab. I live in a tent in the desert and move from place to place. I pray to Allah.

2nd Child: I am a Jew, one of Yahweh's chosen people. I pray to the God of my fathers Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

3rd Child: I am from India. I honour God in all forms of life. I believe in a God who has many forms.

4th Child: I come from Italy. I honour God as my Father and follow His Son Jesus who came to save all people.

5th Child: I am an Indian from America and follow the Great Spirit who loves and cares for all of his creation.

6th Child: I am from Papua New Guinea. I am a Christian. I believe in God my Father, his Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Sing: Make me your brother, make me your friend. Make me a part of your life till its end. Accept me in full, whatever I be, whatever my race, whatever my creed.

Jn 4:5-10:

Jesus, tired out by the journey, sat down by the well... A Samaritan woman came to draw some water, and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink of water."....

The woman answered, "You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan – so how can you ask me for a drink?" (Jews will not use the same cups and bowls that Samaritans use.).

Leader:

Jesus was a Jew. The woman who came to get water was a Samaritan. As soon as Jesus asked her for a drink she reminded him of this. His people and her people did not even talk to each other. But Jesus told her he was ready to help anyone who asked him. He saw every person as part of God the Father's Family. Jesus told all of us to call God our Father. If God is our Father then, like Jesus, we have to be ready to be CHILDREN HELPING CHILDREN all around the world. Let us show we are all one people and ready to reach out and help each other by giving our offering. (Collect money for CHILDREN HELPING CHILDREN)

Sing or pray: Our Father,..

Leader:

Now let us pray that all people will come to know God as Father and that we will work together with all people as children of God and brothers and sisters of Jesus.

Response: Let the peoples praise you o God.

- --That all people who do not know God our Father will receive the gift of Faith.

- -That all churches work together to bring the light of God's word into the darkness of our world. Res.

Leader: Let us respond by singing:

Closing song: All the earth proclaim the Lord.
Sing your praise to God.

118. UNITY WEEK

Christ always gives his Church the gift of unity, but the Church must pray and work to maintain this unity. This is why Jesus himself prayed for the unity of his disciples: "That they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be one in us." The desire for unity of all Christians is a gift of Christ and a call of the Holy Spirit.

STRENGTH IN TOGETHERNESS:

An aged dying father called his seven sons around him. He gave each one a stick and said, "Break it." Each son easily broke his separate stick. The old father then bound seven sticks into a bundle, gave it to his eldest son and said, "Break it." He could not. Nor could any of the rest. "So," said the father, "it should be with you. Alone you are weak, together you are strong."



"I pray that they may all be one. Father! May they be in us, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they be one, so that the world will believe that you sent me. I gave them the same glory you gave me, so that they may be one, just as you and I are one. I in them and you in me, so that they may be completely one, in order that the world may know that you sent me and that you love them as you love me." In 17:21-23


